
Board of Trustees Update September 2024

- Professional development for Student Services leaders




Fall 2024 Welcome Week

- Additionally, a special session will be conducted with the Puente English 1A class, exploring "Intercultural Communication with an Indigenous Focus."

- Voter Engagement Initiatives that Gavilan is participating in this semester:
 - The California University and College <u>Ballot Bowl</u> is a friendly competition where higher education campuses compete to register the most students to vote and showcase civic engagement efforts. The California Secretary of State Students Vote Project hosts the Ballot Bowl only during an even numbered year ahead of the general election.
 - The Community College <u>Concert Competition</u> is a nationwide, nonpartisan effort to turn out student voters at 2-year institutions, and entry is EXCLUSIVE to community colleges. Financial Aid staff have been diligently processing applications for Fall 24 and preparing for our first disbursement of the new semester. Additionally, staff have participated in several events promoting community and Student Success:

Outreach and collaboration with Financial Aid has generated a positive and impactful response from incoming students.

- On August 15th, the Accessible Education Center (AEC) held a new student orientation for incoming students with disabilities. The event was so popular that a bigger room had to be reserved the day prior to accommodate more students and families.
- Congratulations to the Accessible Education Center for reporting an overall increase of 27% more students served in academic year 2023-24 over the prior year.
- On August 21st, the Veterans Resource Center held a virtual orientation for new student veterans to meet our VRC Counselor and school certifying official. This event is intended to support incoming student veterans with connection and developing a sense of belonging.
