The top 22 highest scored eligible applicants are invited to the program. The next 10 highest scored applicants are considered as alternates. Applicants who are invited to the program must submit the "Intent to Enroll" within the stated deadline indicated on the Acceptance Letter. MATERNAL/NEWBORN AND NURSING CARE OF CHILDREN COMPETENCY TESTS

Have you taken the ATI Maternal/Newborn and Nursing Care of Children Competency Tests within the past year? If yes, what was your score? (upload your test results in NursingCAS). If not, **may be retaken once and must be completed and reported by May 31st, 2024**.

Applicants must also demonstrate content mastery in Maternal/Newborn Nursing and Nursing Care of Children by scoring a minimum of (level 2) in Maternal/Newborn Nursing and (level 2) in Nursing Care of Children. The competency exam results cannot be older than 1 year old. They may be retaken once if older than one year old or if the student is not able to achieve the proficiency level (level 2 for both competency tests). **Student is responsible for payment of ATI fees each time test is repeated.**

- You are expected to pay for the costs of the Maternal/Newborn and Nursing Care of Children content mastery exams. **Please be prepared with a photo ID, credit card or debit card on the day of the exam to pay for the tests online. A username and password are required in order to take the exams.**
