NEW COURSE PROPOSAL - SECOND READING

ANTH 6 Culture and Politics of Africa 3 Units, 3 Lec, 0 Lab Historical and contemporary cultural diversity of Africa emphasizing its social, political and economic structures and symbolic systems. Themes include: colonialism, politics, ethnic identity, religion, gender, race, social movements, environment and performance. Examines processes of development and globalization. Case studies of particular societies, chosen to reveal variety, are examined comparatively.

ESL 509B Basic ESL Review II

Description: This is a basic ESL course designed to help students review and maintain grammar and speaking skills between semesters. The emphasis will be on oral production centered around life skill areas such as food, families, work, clothing, health, home, school, shopping, recreation and transportation. Grammar tenses (present, present continuous, and past) will be reviewed and practiced. The course integrates listening, speaking, reading, and writing with an emphasis on oral communication. This is a pass/ no pass course.

JFT 205Fire Continued Professional Training.5 - 5 Units, .114 - 2.85 Lec, .642 - 8.57 Lab

Description: This course provides training which is required by the California State Fire Marshall to keep firefighters current with new equipment, policies, laws and skills needed to be prepared in the line of duty.

JFT 207 First Responder 1-2 Units, 1.14-2.28 Lec, 1.14-2.28 Lab

Description: This course presents an exciting opportunity to develop emergency medical skills and knowledge that will enable the student to assist people who have sustained an accidental injury or have a medical problem. This course fully addresses the objectives in the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) First Responder National Standard Curriculum and will provide the knowledge and skills needed to work as a first responder.

Health, Safety, Nutrition for Young Children 3 Units, 3 Lec, 0 Lab **CD 9** Change Description:

The key components that promote physical health, mental health and safety for both children and staff will be identified along with the importance of collaboration with families and health professionals. Introductions to the laws, regulations standards, policies and procedures and early childhood curriculum related to child health safety and nutrition. Focus on integrating the concepts into curriculum planning and program development for all children. Poison prevention, fire and earthquake safety and emergency preparedness is covered.
