**NEW COURSE PROPOPAL - SECOND READING**

**[JFT 30](#) Paramedic Core  
11-14 Units, 289-330 Lec, 167-230 Lab**

This course is designed to guide students to successful completion of the National Registry EMT-Paramedic exam and meets the training requirements mandated by the State of California, California Code of Regulations Title 22. The didactic instruction represents the delivery of primarily cognitive material. This is the first part of a three-part program. Students must successfully complete the didactic portion of training prior to progressing to Clinical training (part two).

**[JFT 31](#) Paramedic – Clinical  
4 – 7 Units, 4.22-13.58 Lec, 0.54-7.88 Lab**

Upon completion of the didactic phase (part one) of paramedic training, the paramedic intern is required to complete a clinical rotation. Clinical training (part two) will be conducted at local contracted hospitals for a minimum of 160 hours to a maximum of 280 hours. Students will be assigned a specific hospital. Clinical internship must be completed within 3 months of the student's first clinical rotation. Field internship (part three) may not begin until the clinical internship is completed and the student successfully completes a clinical closeout meeting.

**[JFT 32](#) Paramedic – Internship 12 – 18 Units, 27.4-41.1 Lab**

Students will be assigned a field internship following successful completion of their clinical internship. The intern returns to a Paramedic mobile intensive care unit (ambulance) where he/she will perform on-the-job duties, under supervision, for a minimum of 480 hours to a

maximum of 720 hours. The field internship portion of training must be completed within six months of the student's first shift date in their field internship.

**JFT 33      Emergency Medical Technician – Refresher**

**.5 – 1 Unit, .45 Lec, .91-1.82 Lab**

EMT-Basic Refresher curriculum consists of 24-40 hours. The refresher training program is divided into six modules and follows the National Standard Curricula. This refresher course is competency based. EMTs who successfully complete this course must demonstrate competency over the knowledge and skills outlined in this refresher education program.

**JLE 163      Special Threats**

**.5 Units, .70 Lec, .23 Lab**

This course gives students the ability to identify potential threats that officers face on a daily basis, during special events, or operations. Students will be up-dated on current trends being utilized by the criminal element to compromise the safety of law enforcement personnel and the options law enforcement personnel have to safely overcome situations. The students will be provided with various methods that they may choose to utilize in a variety of situations which will enhance their situational awareness.

**PE 82      Circuit Training**

**.5 – 1 Unit, 1.5 – 3.0 Lab**

This class is a combination of aerobic exercise and resistance training designed to simultaneously improve mobility, strength, and stamina. Students will rotate from station to station, alternating between cardio and muscle toning exercises. May be repeated three times for credit. This course has the option of a letter grade or pass/no pass.

**MODIFICATION TO EXISTING COURSE - FORM C**

**AJ 20      Juvenile Law and Procedure**

**3 Units, 3 Lec, 0 Lab**

Change Description:

This course covers techniques of handling juvenile offenders and victims; prevention and repression of delinquency; diagnosis and referral; and organization of community resources. The course also includes juvenile law and juvenile court procedure with a strong emphasis on California law, including the California Penal and Welfare and Institution Codes.

**3 Units, 3 Lec**

**CD 18      The Outdoor Classroom**

**3 Units, 3 Lec, 0 Lab**

Change Description:

In light of the evidence linking the lack of nature in children's lives to the rise in obesity, attention disorders, and depression, this course will teach participants how to create developmentally appropriate outdoor play and nature learning experiences for children from

birth to age eight, ensure that outdoor environments are accessible and safe, and methodically observe and assess children's outdoor play.

**2 Units, 1 Lec, 3 Lab**

**DISTANCE EDUCATION – FORM D**

**ART 14      **Introduction to Murals****

Justification: This course is ideal for offering as a hybrid course because of the considerable amount of lecture and groupwork that can be conducted via an online format. Students in this course are required to collaborate extensively with each other; having the online format facilitates this work.

**ART 25A, ART 25B, CD 25A, CD 25B      **Art Methods****

Justification: This course is ideal for offering as a hybrid course because of the considerable amount of lecture and groupwork that can be conducted via an online format. Additionally, the online component for this course will enable students the flexibility to more easily collaborate with their classmates and instructor particularly in sharing their observation reports.

**MODIFICATION TO EXISTING PROGRAM – FORM G**

**AA Degree and Certificate of Achievement - Administration of Justice – Corrections Option**

The Administration of Justice AA/Corrections Option and Corrections Certificate of Achievement (Pg 68 of the 2009-2011 catalog) are locally and temporarily cancelled for 1 to 2 years.

The AJ program does not have a full time or adjunct instructor in this unique field and the current budget situation does not allow us to hire one.

In the interim we will allow courses transferred from other institutions to fulfill the requirement or the following Gavilan courses: AJ 173, AJ 176, AJ 20, and AJ 32 for students already declared as "Corrections Option" majors.

AJ 170 and AJ 171 courses are deactivated and current students declared as "Corrections Option" majors will be able to use AJ 173, AJ 176, AJ 20, and AJ 32 as course substitutes to complete their degree (21 units) or certificate (18 units).
