NEW COURSE PROPOSAL – SECOND READING

CARP 200 Introduction to Apprenticeship

1.5 Units, 22 Lec, 14 Lab

Introduction to Apprenticeship course is designed to make the apprentice familiar with the tools and skills to be successful in construction. This includes hazard awareness, safe use of selected power tools, review of mathematics used in construction and understanding the Union and apprentice's role and responsibilities.

JFT 9C Fire Instructor 1C

1 Unit, .8 Lec, 1.48 Lab

This instructor training will assist and help prepare students to become instructors who can provide effective training programs. Students will identify elements of a course outline, develop lesson plans and create audiovisual training aids.

KIN 15 Sports and Society

3 Units, 3 Lec, 0 Lab

This course examines the role of sports in society. It will look at how sports influences and shapes the world by investigating the historical, social, economic and political impact of sports on society.

MODIFICATIONS TO EXISTING COURSES – FORM C

CWE 192 General Work Experience Education

1 - 4 Units, 5 - 20 Lab

Change Description:

General work experience is for students who have a job unrelated to their major. General work experience is supervised employment which is intended to assist students in acquiring desirable work habits, attitudes and career awareness. A training plan is developed cooperatively between the employer, college and student. (CR/NC grading) 75 hours per semester paid work = 1 unit. 60 hours non-paid (volunteer) work per semester = 1 unit. May be taken for a maximum of 16 units. Minimum 2.0 GPA.

ENGL 250P Practical Writing

3 Units, 3 Lec, 1 Lab

Add a version of ENGL 250, with prerequisites removed and grading set to pass/no pass. All other aspects of the course will be the same. This version will be identified as ENGL 250P.

Co-requisite: ENGL 260P

Justification: To pilot an accelerated English model that has been successful over ten years at other campuses, we plan to offer this class to students without a prerequisite but instead have informed self-placement. Students will not receive letter grades but pass or no pass, allowing all to focus on essential skills of the course rather than grading.

ENGL 260P Preparation for College Reading

3 Units, 3 Lec, 0 Lab

Add a version of ENGL 260, with prerequisites removed and grading set to pass/no pass. All other aspects of the course will be the same. This version will be identified as ENGL 260P.

Co-requisite: ENGL 250P

Justification: To pilot an accelerated English model that has been successful over ten years at other campuses, we plan to offer this class to students without a prerequisite but instead have informed self-placement.
