NEW COURSE PROPOSAL – SECOND READING

ENGL 9D Advanced Fiction

3 Units, 3 Lec, 0 lab

This course is an immersion into fiction and its creation. The class is primarily on creating new pieces of writing and provides many opportunities for the generation of short stories and novel excerpts. A secondary focus is placed on giving and getting peer-based feedback to encourage the writer in returning to his or her work and to identify unexplored possibilities within it. Thirdly, emphasis is placed on a multitude of narrative approaches as well as the development of terminology useful in both creating and analyzing the creation of fiction.

MATH 411 Integrated Pre-Algebra

6 Units, 6 Lec, 1 lab

This course is a blend of a standard Elements of Arithmetic and Pre algebra courses with the focus on operations with whole numbers, fractions, decimals, percentages, proportions, and signed numbers. Algebraic topics such as variables, expressions, and solving basic linear equations and applications are introduced. This is pass/ no pass course where pass is given for the mastery of the above topics. The mastery level is set by the department.

CD 202 Early Child Dev in Spanish

3 Units, Lec, 0 Lab

This course examines typical and atypical development within the psychosocial, cognitive, and physical domains from conception through the preschool years. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to evaluate theories and research of child development and effectively apply and communicate their understanding through observation and evaluation. Note: This course will be taught in Spanish.

ESL 784 NC ESL Lifeskills 1A

0 units, 6 Lec, 0 Lab

This is the first course in a series of English classes for students with very little oral or written English competency. It will give students basic vocabulary and familiarity in life skill areas such as family, food,

health, and occupations to manage in the real world. This course emphasizes oral communication and integrates listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

ESL 785 NC ESL Lifeskills 1B

0 units, 6 Lec, 0 Lab

This is the second course in a series of English classes for students with very little oral or written English competency. It will give students basic vocabulary and familiarity in life skill areas such as weather, transportation, employment, and American holidays and customs to manage in the real world. This course emphasizes oral communication and integrates listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

ESL 786 NC ESL Fundamentals 2A

0 units, 6 Lec, 0 Lab

This is the third course in a series of English classes for students with little oral or written English competency. Through listening, speaking, reading and writing activities, students learn to use grammatical structures of English with increasing accuracy while gaining basic life skills. This course begins to prepare students for transfer into the ESL credit program.

ESL 787 NC ESL Fundamentals 2B

0 units, 6 Lec, 0 Lab

This is the fourth course in a series of English classes for students with little oral or written English competency. Through listening, speaking, reading and writing activities, students learn to use grammatical structures of English with increasing accuracy while gaining basic life skills. This course prepares students for transfer into the ESL credit program.

Change description: An open laboratory for those who desire an individualized cardiovascular fitness program utilizing the FITTE principles. High intensity training programs such as stage training and circuit training will be included. This course has the option of a letter grade or pass/no pass.

KIN 71A Self Defense - Level 1 .5 - 1 unit, 0 Lec, 1.5 - 3 Lab

Based on the new repeatability requirements for activity classes, we need to develop a "family" of courses for self-defense. In addition we are dropping the "for Women" from the course title based on feedback from student evaluations and the instructor's recommendation based on SLO assessments. Student evaluations indicate they would like a co-ed class where they can practice their self-defense skills in a more realistic situation.

Change description: This course is an introduction and exploration of self-defense and personal safety. Emphasis on basic physical combative skills such as punches, strikes, blocks, and escape holds. It will also include basic non-combative skills such as risk reduction techniques, body language, positioning tactics, and verbal responses to threats. This course has the option of a letter

grade or pass/no pass.

KIN 71B Self Defense - Level 2 .5 - 1 unit, 0 Lec, 1.5 - 3 Lab

FROM: KIN 71 Self-Defense for Women TO: KIN 71B Self Defense - Level 2

Change description: This course will focus on increasingly complex self-defense situations such as attacks on the ground, counter tactics to a variety of advance chokes, bear hugs, hair pulls, and headlocks. Emphasis will be placed on distraction and de-escalation techniques as well as clinch and close-range fighting and survival skills. This course has the option of a letter grade or pass/no pass.

<u>KIN 71C</u> Self Defense - Level 3 .5 - 1 unit, 0 Lec, 1.5 - 3 Lab

Change title:

FROM: KIN 71 Self-Defense for Women TO: KIN 71C Self Defense - Level 3

Change description: This course will cover more depth into defenses against a variety of advanced attacks including submission holds, throws, and a diverse range of weapons. Includes defensive falling techniques, use of personal weapons, tactics against multiple attackers, and third party protection. Increased focus on mind-body balance, awareness and avoidance capabilities, kicking and striking techniques, and adrenaline and trauma management. This course has the option of a letter grade or pass/no pass.

Change description: Introduction to theory, terminology and operation of a multi-camera television studio and control room. Including: production, studio signal flow, directling, camera theory and operation, audio equipment set-up, switcher operation, fundatmental of lighting, graphics, video control and recording and live video production.

PHIL 2 Introduction to Logic 3 units, 3 Lec, 0 Lab

Update course description to align with C-ID.

Change description: Logic is the study of good reasoning. This course will explore two important modes of reasoning: deduction and induction. We will use formal methods from sentential logic, including truth tables and proofs, to test for correct or 'valid' inferences. Common mistakes in reasoning (i.e., fallacies)

will be examined, as well as language and scientific reasoning. Practical application of logic outside the classroom will be emphasized. ADVISORY: Eligible for English 1A."
