Susan reported that Bonnie Donovan distributes the list of courses that need to be updated. Jesus Olivas reported that the lower division pattern has been reviewed and presented at Department Chairs. He reviewed the courses to be assigned new numbers for CSU transfer patterns. He noted that some courses need textbook and course outline updates. He will email those people who need to make the changes. Even if classes are not being offered, they need to be updated because we want to maintain the university articulation. If they are not maintained, it takes two years to get them re-articulated. He also reported that he is submitting courses for UC transfer agreements, those submitted before November will be approved for fall 2007.

C. Classes Taught in Spanish

Jesus would like to begin a discussion on whether we should offer transfer courses taught in Spanish. He is concerned that students are being encouraged to enroll without being academically qualified for the same rigor as the English-taught class. Students are not being screened. He stated that the same standard needs to be maintained in the Spanish-taught class as in the English-taught class as required by the universities. Susan asked committee members to talk to their constituent groups for further discussion at the next meeting.

Terry Newman reported that her department is working on developing a list of potential course offerings. She stated that her report to the Board, including enrollment numbers, will be available shortly. Terry will forward to Susan who will then distribute to the committee.
