- d. MCTV_THEA_18 Single Camera Production A required course in the degree and written closely to the C-ID descriptor. A question was raised if the course was a repeat of a digital media course currently being offered. This is a television production course and not a digital media course. The committee may need to address which discipline would head the submission of courses. The minimum course of action is for disciplines to discuss courses together before submission. The first step is for the course CI-Ds to be approved before the degree can be approved. The transfer degrees need to be fully approved and currently only three transfer degrees are approved. One suggestion is for the department that houses the degree to oversee the courses. There needs to be long-term solutions to the dilemma of repeating courses offered.

CHN 1A/CHN 1B, ESL 548, ESL 557, ESL 573 HORT 20, ITAL 8A/ITAL 8B, JLE 179 JOUR 18C/JOUR 18D, THEA/MCTV 17B, THEA 21 CSIS 20, CSIS 47, DM111, BUS 102 MGMT102, MKTG 100 When an articulated course is deactivated it takes a year and a half to reactivate the course. The consequence to the program needs to be considered when deactivating courses. A new code could be created called 'hold' which is a local code. This gives the committee more time to discuss the results of inactivating courses. Details on the 'hold' course needs to be determined by the committee. This is creating a whole new level and they still need to be printed in the course catalogue. Another solution is to deactivate courses and then bring the course back under a new number. A suggestion is to link the course to the catalogue so courses would have a two year 'hold' limit. The four codes would be active, inactive, on hold and suspended.

A motion was made to put the courses on hold for 2 years and to bring back for further discussion.
