New Business

- 1 NEW COURSE PROPOSAL FIRST READING
 - a. CARP 218 Commercial Concrete
 This course is designed to make apprentices familiar with the concepts and practices of commercial concrete construction.
 - b. CARP 219 Rigging

This course is designed to make apprentices familiar with the safe practices involved in the rigging and hoisting of loads on the job site.

c. CARP 220 Commercial Door Hardware

This course teaches apprentices the basic skills necessary to successfully install commercial door hardware.

CARP 218, 219, 220 are taken as on motion.

These courses are electives and are part of Los Rios carpentry program.
