- 1 NEW COURSE PROPOSAL FIRST READING
  - a. JLE 301 Dispatch Radio Communications
    This course is designed for students to enhance dispatcher skills, specifically focusing on radio communications. The hours are not state mandated but required by area agencies.
  - b. JLE 302 Counselor/Officer Training Provides students training in Gangs, Homicide, Counseling, Counselor expectations, legal issues, child development, programs, youth development, safety and emergency procedures, active shooter and evacuations. The training ranges from active listening and behavioral management to lecture and case scenarios. Training complies with POST, American Association Standards for Counselors and ADA.
