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GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- File a Petition to Graduate with the Admissions and Records Office by April 1 for Spring or Summer graduation, and by October 1 to graduate at the end of the Fall Semester. One petition must be filed for each Associate Degree, Certificate of Achievement or Certificate of Proficiency the student expects to receive.
- 2. Maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 ("C") or higher for all work attempted and a grade of "C" or higher in each major or certificate courses.
- 3. Complete a minimum of 18 units of coursework in a major. Specific major course requirements are listed in the college catalog.
- 4. Complete a minimum of 60 semester units. Within the (60) unit requirement, the (9) units in Area A, and B-4 must be

completed with a grade of "C" or better in each course. Complete 12 units at Gavilan College.
