Studies and techniques in braiding, weaving, glass nails, silk wrap, individual lash and brow tinting, corrective make-up and low lights. This is a 6 week class offered in summer session only. PREREQUISITE: Satisfactory completion of COS 200. Intermediate and Advanced cosmetology enrollments only.

6. Discuss color theory, analyze facial features and describe different facial shapes and eyebrows, as well as use light and dark colors to highlight and contour features.
