COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers the legal requirements for carrying and using firearms. Participants are instructed in the safe handling of firearms and techniques of shooting. This course is certified by the Commission on Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST). This is a pass/no pass PREREQUISITE: JLE 100 or Equivalent or Department of Justice Clearance (DOJ).

Lab content:

Peace officers must comprehend and practice the fundamental skills of firing firearms to be effective in reactive and

precision situations during live fire exercises.

III. Firearms Range (15 hours)

a. Demonstrate/Practice

An exercise test developed by POST that specifically prescribes the PC 832 course of

fire, which requires the student to demonstrate basic handgun shooting principles under daylight conditions. The student is required to tactically load and reload the handgun using the loading device

authorized by the presenter and successfully clear any malfunctions that may occur during the course of fire. POST Examination (1 hour)

a. Required exercise testing for each format is set forth in the Training and Testing specifications. The student is required to

successfully pass each exercise test outlined for the specific course of instruction in which the student is enrolled.

b. Students are required to comply with every aspect of presenter safety procedures and or protocols during firearms training

and testing.

NOTE: Because of the integrated nature of the lab/lecture

method of instruction, the content for both lecture and lab are infused. Course is repeated as necessary for students to meet a legally mandated training requirement as a condition of continued paid or volunteer employment.

METHODS OF INSTRUCTION:

Lecture, discussion and demonstration will serve as the medium of instruction. Individual guidance will be provided as required. POST Skills exam
