

The bibliography should appear as the last page of your research paper. It should be titled, Bibliography. The entire list should be **single-spaced** and in **alphabetical order** by the last name of each author. If the author's name is unknown, alphabetize by the title, ignoring any initial *The*, *A*, or *An*. There is a **five space indention** after the first line of each citation.
