Vision/Narrative

The Gavilan College Child Development and Educational Studies Program awards certificates and degrees to pre-service and in-service child development professionals, transfer level coursework for future elementary and secondary teachers, and continuing education for employees in a variety of fields. CDES faculty are committed to the goal of providing every student with the opportunity to work with children in a campus child development lab school to experience effective practice and program planning in early childhood programs and begin to develop skills and strategies for implementing such practices. California continues to increase the demand for students to meet state standards by having all college Child Development Programs align their course content and SLOs. We have aligned CDES courses with the Chancellor's Office. The State Department of Education developed statewide early learning foundations and standards have been incorporated into our CDES courses. With this increase in consistency across the state our classrooms and practicum programs must meet these standards. This increases the need for Gavilan College CDES program to align with local early childhood programs until the college can develop a lab school. We continue to struggle with increasing student costs covering new requirements for students to be fingerprinted, transportation to sites and the need for experiences working with children from infancy to school age development. We maintain MOUs with community agencies and continue to build relationships with community programs that might offer accredited, high quality experiences for our students. We have no accredited early childhood programs in Gilroy, Hollister and Morgan Hill. This further compromises the student experience not only for our CDES majors in terms of availability/quality experience, but also increases our need to develop appropriate guidelines for their work with young children.

IEC Program Review:

No: The Chancellor's Office has instituted a new requirement for 24 Child Development units for each Transitional Kindergarten (TK) classroom teacher. All California Elementary School Districts have TK classrooms. There are 6-8 new courses that need development and then faculty to teach those classes. The CDES program is currently working with 2 full time faculty and 7 adjunct instructors. We are strengthening our transfer degree program for Early Childhood Education and finishing up on a transfer degree for Elementary Education. With the addition of the new courses we will need to have faculty with experience and connections with public education.

Progress:

Yes: We are beginning to review current course work and developing the new courses required by the state for Transitional Kindergarten programs. We are meeting with school districts to determine best delivery systems for this instruction. Curriculum development and potential Certificate Program will follow.
