Vision/Narrative

Program Overview:

Gavilan's Theatre Art program offers AA degrees in Acting and Technical theatre, and an AA-T in Theatre. A variety of performance and design related courses are offered, as well as courses geared towards the general education students (Theatre Appreciation, Oral Interpretation, Theatre History). The program participates in on-going community outreach not only through their multiple performance offerings each year, but also through the ABC (Arts Back in the Classroom) internships and their partnership with Christopher High School's budding Arts and Theatre programs. Theatre Arts students are successfully transferring into the state and UC systems; Isabel Cruz has just graduated with Honors from UCB and is exploring Graduate School Options. Former Gavilan student and Student Trustee Isabel Quistian graduated from UC Santa Cruz two years ago, and was hired by Theatre Arts as their new Technical Coordinator. This Fall, Gavilan Theatre Arts AA Brian Carmack successfully transferred into the Theatre Program at UCSC.

With the new Technical Coordinator, Izzy Quistian, on board the Theatre Arts Program is identifying all potential fire & safety hazards and liability issues that have been neglected in the past. This has added a tremendous amount of requests to the Program Plan for Theatre Arts. Most of these requests have to do with upkeep, Health& Safety, and FireCode in the Theatre facility - a larger issue for Gavilan College with the many outside (Nutcrackers, Dance Concerts, SVSymphony) and internal (Jazz Festival, Bach 2 Blues, Student Talent Show, Flex Day, Felice Piano Competition and multiple Theatre Arts perfromances) user groups that regularly schedule events in the Theatre Building.

Program Learning Outcomes

Acting: after completing this degree the student will be able to:

- Describe significant movements or genres in theatre history, and to elaborate on their social and cultural significance.
- Work effectively in a team, having developed collaboration and teamwork skills through class exercises, assignments and performances.

• Articulate the differences in theatrical styles and modes of creation. Students participate in both the organic creative process (in which the students participate in the creation of the performance or play) and the more traditional approaches to theatre and performance using an established or already created text.

- Critique theatrical performances, articulating the playwright's view and director's interpretation of the text. Students can evaluate the various technical elements of the production (costume, sets, lights & amp; amp; sound), to determine whether they support or detract from the production and text.
- Demonstrate practical knowledge regarding the responsibilities of the different technical and creative jobs related to theatre and theatre production.
- Master fundamental concepts and vocabulary relating to acting through class exercises and public performances.

Technical Theatre: after completing this degree the student will be able to:

- Master vocabulary and a working knowledge regarding the different technical and creative jobs related to theatre and theatre production.
- Develop creative proficiency in designing sets, costumes, lights or sound for Gavilan productions.



• Work effectively in a team, having developed collaboration and teamwork skills through class exercises, assignments and performances.

• Describe significant movements or genres in theatre history, and to elaborate on their social and cultural significance.

• Critique theatrical performances, evaluating the various technical elements of the production (costume, sets, lights & amp; amp; sound), to determine whether they support or detract from the production and text

Program Philosophy:.

Theatre and acting students achieve self-confidence, learn teamwork and creativity skills through class projects and performances. Theatre encourages students to take risks, to focus and concentrate, and the tremendous power of personal commitment to a project or play.

Performance gives us greater insight to ourselves and the lives of others. Studying theatre and acting help us find our inner identity, and allow us to change ourselves, using our own personal experiences to create new characters and existences. Theatre in the college environment allows us to create and learn through a shared artistic experience. New Program Efforts

1. Create new Summer Arts bridge Program as part of Dr. Haehl's sabbatical research project. This Arts bridge program will attract Santa Clara & amp; amp; amp; amp; amp; amp; amp; San Benito County High School students to Gavilan's Theatre Arts Program, and help to expedite their participation in the new AA-T in Theatre arts.

2. Create AA-T in Theatre Arts, with new courses approved in Script Analysis, Lighting and Costume Design.

3. Cultivate mutual artistic projects with Christopher High Theatre Program, including a collaborative production of a musical in Spring 2017

Ongoing Program Efforts:


- 1. Revamp the Theatre equipment, degree and course offerings to reflect student needs and industry changes.

- 3. Explore new ways to give student performance and production experience and opportunities.
- 4. Analyze student learning outcomes to ensure they support PLOs.
- 5. Expand course offerings to ensure student success with AA and transfer options.

The Future of the Theatre Arts Program:

Theatre continues its efforts to provide quality theatrical education and performances to the South Valley Community. As the only theatre arts program between Salinas and San Jose, Gavilan College Theatre is perfectly situated to serve the South Santa Clara & amp; amp; amp; amp; amp; San Benito Counties. Every Fall we offer a Children's Theatre production, attended each year by over 3000 elementary school students from Hollister, Gilroy, Aromas and Morgan Hill. As the program and production offerings continue to grow, we anticipate needing one full-time faculty member in Design/Performance, as well as one full-time (50% staff; 50% Faculty) position to support the increased production needs of the program.

Feedback from Supervisor / Dean

This plan is extensive and the thoughtfulness with which it was completed is evident. Parts of the plan would benefit from being re-framed. For example, most of the technology and physical resource requests would be better suited to activities listed under a program objective of ensuring the student experience is served with the latest resources available (or something else). The last few objectives are very well received. The program should be challenged to connect these items to the SLO/PLO work they already mention is underway, as well as to set some clear and explicit goals for the near and short term. These objectives lend themselves to such goals, and the activities are appropriate to



achieving them. The program should be commended for its work.






