TRiO Student Services

Vision/Narrative

TRIO is a federally funded student support services program designed to empower first generation, low income, and disabled Gavilan College students as they obtain a two-year degree and/or transfer to a four-year university. TRIO's community of success includes support to graduate and/or transfer to a four-year university, case management/intrusive academic counseling, priority registration, TRIO financial grants, a summer bridge program, laptop/ calculator lending, financial aid assistance, campus visits to 4 year universities, Informational workshops, cultural activities, career and personal development activities. Recently, the TRIO grant was renewed for another five years. As part of the grant the requirement for the graduation rate increased from 40% to 55% as an outcome requirement for each cohort.

Within the last several years the program has evolved and expanded the services that have been offered to students. These include but are not limited to the following.

- Students now have access to tutoring support services in various subjects that include and are not limited to writing, mathematics, statistics, chemistry, biology, social sciences and allied health.
- TRIO Students have greater access to technology and can barrow new laptop computers until the next business day and calculators for the semesters
- TRIO/MESA Student Success Conference is implemented twice an academic year and includes a variety of workshops, activities, and guest speakers.
- The summer bridge program has evolved into a Math acceleration summer bridge to help close the gap of the time students spend to reach graduation.
- Increase in the Cultural and community building activities that help to develop students

The increased workload requires adequate support to complete grant outcomes and help with remedying the gaps identified in the Gavilan College equity plan. MESA/TRIO are prime programs to help remedy this gap given that the programs goals are to help graduate and transfer underrepresented students with a demographic that consist of mostly Hispanic Students.
