## UC/CSU Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum 2024-2025

Completion of all the requirements in the IGETC will permit a student to transfer from a community college to the California State University or the University of California without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements. All areas must be satisfied, and all courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better before the IGETC can be certified. See requirements for partial IGETC certification in catalog. A student is strongly advised to complete a total of 60 transferable units before transferring. These will include the IGETC requirements, "major" prerequisites, and elective courses if needed. (Students must request an IGETC certification from the Office of Admissions and Records before transferring.)

## **Supplementary Notes:**

- 1. A single course, even if listed in multiple places, can only be used to satisfy one subject area of the IGETC. However, courses in Languages Other Than English can be certified in both areas 3B and 6A.
- 2. IGETC is not advisable for high-unit majors, e.g., sciences and engineering.
- 3. Revelle College at UC San Diego does not accept the IGETC.
- 4. IGETC may not be appropriate for students who have completed courses at a CSU or UC campus.
- 5. "Double counting" of courses toward the major is not limited by the IGETC but may be limited by other directives. The UC will allow IGETC courses to count toward major requirements. CSU campus limitations on double-counting of general education courses toward major preparation are not changed by the IGETC.
- 6. LOTE is not required for IGETC certification.
- 7. UC does not require a communications course.

## CSU Graduation Requirement in U.S. History, Constitution and American Ideals:

- Not part of IGETC. May be completed prior to transfer. For the baccalaureate degree, CSU requires one of the following combinations: HIST 1 and 2, or POLS 1 with either HIST 1 or 2.
- CSU campuses have the discretion to allow courses used to satisfy the CSU US History, Constitution and American Ideals (AI) graduation requirement to count in both areas 3B or 4B and to meet the graduation requirement.

#### **CSU STEM Majors:**

Approved CSU ADT (Associate Degree for Transfer) in Biology and Chemistry requires one less class in Area 4 (in different disciplines).
